PART 1: RULES FOR BUILDING YOUR SEARCH

Rule 1:	Rule 2:
Choose the most important terms that describe your topic. These become your search terms, or <i>keywords</i> .	Put quotation marks around common phrases in your search terms. Phrase searching ensures that those words appear together in your results.
<u>Example Topic:</u> Are video games bad for teenagers?	<u>Keywords/search terms using phrase searching:</u> "video games" teenagers impact
<u>Keywords:</u> video games teenagers impact	<u>Note that single words do not need quotation marks:</u> teenagers impact
