

OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT AS AN UNDERGRADUATE MAJOR

Operations Management (OM) is about getting things done effectively and efficiently in organizations. All organizations have an operations function. Operations managers might work in managing manufacturing processes or managing the delivery of a service to a customer. Operations Management provides a strong managerial and technical education to students interested in the field including manufacturing planning and control, supply-chain, service, project, process and quality management. The major prepares students with the fundamental knowledge they need to work effectively in operations in manufacturing and service sectors, providing them with advanced knowledge about the best practices, current technologies and tools, and the leadership skills necessary to operate in a globally diverse and competitive marketplace.
